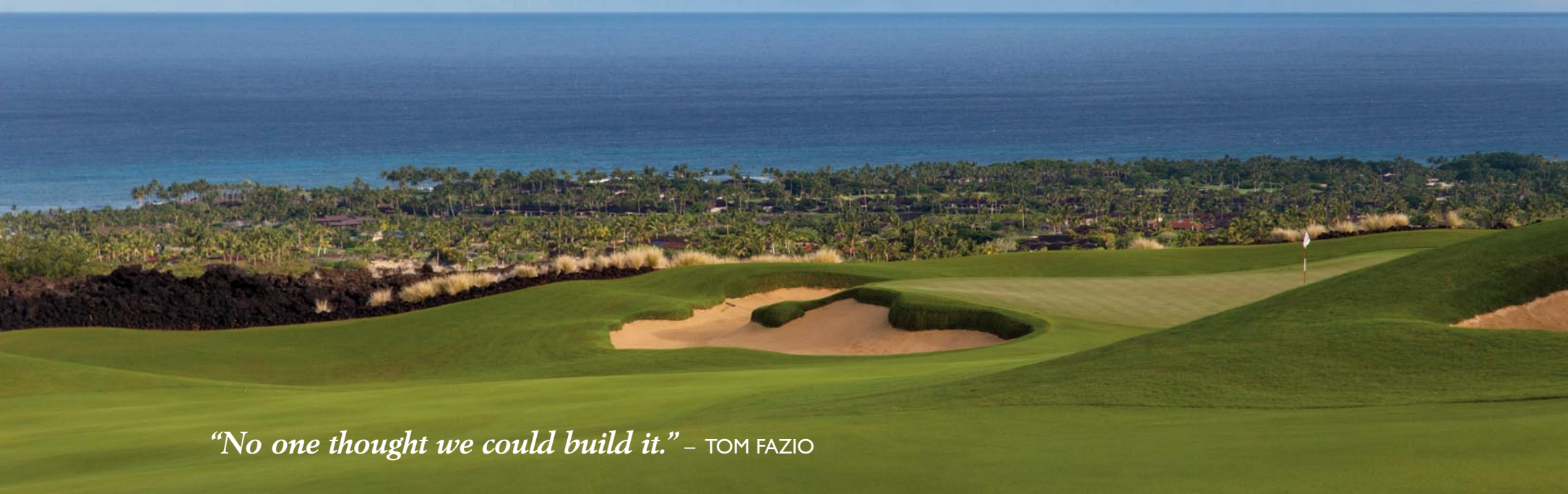


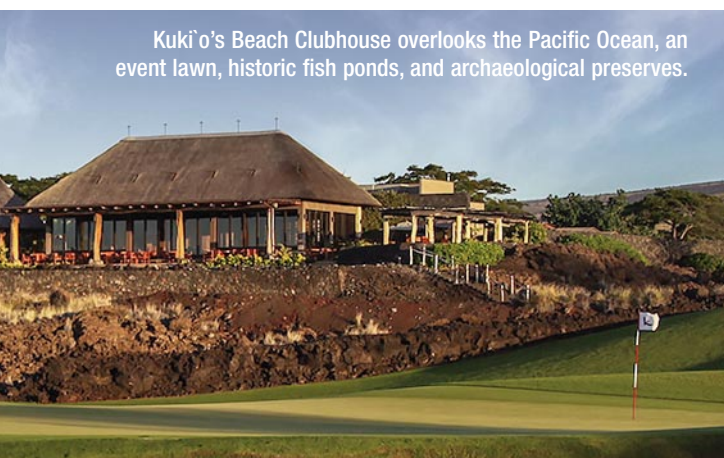

KONA, HAWAII: “Kuki`o is one of the greatest clubs!” praised Fazio. “It is my only design in Hawaii. It was a major commitment to commute from Florida to the Big Island. “The execution of building over jagged lava was difficult,” described Fazio. “We had to ‘walk’ a bulldozer over the lava flow to evaluate where to situate the course in relation to the coastline. Kuki`o, developed by Discovery Land Company, is now a member-owned and operated equity club. It has a regulation length, 18-hole Fazio course built into the slopes of Hualalai Mountain and a 10-hole Fazio course closer to shore.

Other amenities include a full-service concierge, ocean-front clubhouses, an on-site bakery, library, a spa and fitness facility, a dining pavilion with a selection of 400 wines, a beach bar, tennis and basketball courts, and a football field.

“When you picture a perfect Hawaiian lifestyle, Kuki`o is it,” said David Johnston, director of real estate sales. “We are in a desirable location, in close proximity to downtown Kona, and our climate provides 345 days of idyllic weather per year.

STATE OF THE HAWAIIAN REAL ESTATE MARKET “Pricing generally lags six months behind mainland trends. Kona has seen a 30 percent increase in value since the market bottomed. We are still far from pre-recession prices, but we are inching back.

“Outrigger canoes, stand-up paddleboards, and a sailing canoe are available anytime,” said Kalmbach. “We even have a Boston Whaler for more ambitious excursions.

“Being so closely connected to the water is powerful. I’ve had the good fortune to swim with pods of dolphins hundreds of times, and it never gets old. The sounds of the ocean are singular to Hawaii. It is hard to describe your emotion when you hear 100 dolphin blowholes puffing salt spray into the air.

“Working here has changed the course of my life. Kuki`o can change yours as well.” ■
